VERY FEW 4-ANNAS COVERS ARE KNOWN TO THIS DESTINATION. Covers to the United States bearing the Lithograph stamps are very rare. We estimate around a dozen covers exist. The sender had a choice whether to send mail westbound via Marseilles or Southampton, or eastbound via private ships across the Pacific.
